AREAS OF WORK




Despite significant progress, preventable maternal deaths remain alarmingly high in parts of Asia and the Pacific. Expanding access to quality reproductive health services— voluntary family planning, safe childbirth and quality maternal care—saves lives and strengthens communities. UNFPA works to uphold the health and rights of women and girls, particularly in hard-to-reach areas, to ensure that no one is left behind.



With 56 per cent of the global youth population in Asia and the Pacific, investing in young people is crucial for the region's future. UNFPA works to ensure they have access to comprehensive sexuality education, life skills and training, and youth-friendly health services, helping young people make informed choices about life-changing matters and transition safely into adulthood.



More than 1 in 4 women in Asia and the Pacific face gender-based violence driven by patriarchal norms that justify harmful practices like child marriage and female genital mutilation. UNFPA works with governments, women's rights organizations and service providers to prevent gender-based violence and ensure survivor-centered care. We help countries adopt global standards for ethical data collection, gender-transformative programmes and life-saving services.



Understanding demographic shifts—
fertility, ageing, migration and urbanization
—is key to future-ready policies that are
embedded in human rights. By 2050, in
Asia and the Pacific, the population aged
60 and over is expected to double, while in
some countries, especially in the Pacific
Islands, over half the population is under
25. UNFPA supports census efforts,
research and policy integration to help
governments ensure equity, workforce
resilience and inclusive growth.



Asia and the Pacific is the world's most disaster-prone region. During conflicts, natural disasters and public health emergencies, UNFPA provides life-saving sexual and reproductive health and gender-based violence response and prevention services to reach those women and girls most at risk. Working across the region, we strengthen humanitarian preparedness, response and resilience, equipping our partners to deliver timely and inclusive care.
